Termin: 25 października – 5 listopada 2019 r.

Tematyka: Projekt skierowany do młodzieży określanej mianem NEET, mający na celu efektywne poszukiwanie zatrudnienia, czy możliwości dalszej edukacji.

Uczestnicy z 8 krajów: Wielka Brytania, Rumunia, Polska, Włochy, Grecja, Hiszpania, Portugalia, Bułgaria.

PROJECT'S AIM AND OBJECTIVES:

1. Improving the CV of the participants (creation of the Europass CV), which will help increase the employment opportunities, minimum 16 young people who will find a job by 31st of December 2019.

2. Creating brochures with opportunities and job searching methods, training, studies, at each community level, which are going to be distributed in paper format by participants to at least 800 young people from the NEET category in their natal localities until the end of the project.

3. Recruitment by participants by 30 November of at least 5 young NEETs (other than those present in activities) in each partner association and their involvement in minimum one voluntary activity by 31st of December 2019.

The aim of the project is to make efforts to help reduce the number of NEETs in the communities involved in the project by creating and offering employment opportunities, initiating studies, training, volunteering, etc.

ABOUT THE PROJECT:

OpportuNEETys is an international youth exchange with partners from 8 European countries: UK, Romania, Italy, Greece, Spain, Portugal, Poland and Bulgaria. It will last 7 months, from 1st of June 2019 until 31st of December 2019, with a period of 10 days of activities, as well as one day for traveling before and one after, between 25 of October and 5th of November 2019, (10 Activities days+2 travel days)12 days in total. The location of the activities is the Sady Guesthouse, in the mountain resort of Vatra Dornei, Romania. At the activities there will be present a group of 56 youngsters aged between 18 and 30, of which 24 young people from NEET category, and 7 group leaders without age limit. All national groups will consist of 7 youngsters and 1 leader.

"OpportuNEETys" is an youth exchange project based on creating and offering job and study opportunities for the young people coming from the countries involved in the program with the highest percentage of NEET youth. The studied problem within the project (NEET youth) is a global one that concerns the international community very much because NEET actually means: unemployment, exclusion, poverty, lack of proper education, immigration and others – problems that the European youth is dealing with.

DURING 10 DAYS OF YOUTH EXCHANGE:

6we will carry on various activities: getting to know each other, learning, experimenting, expressing, creation and cultural expression, and will use various innovative non-formal learning methods: introspection, games, team building activities, brainstorming, public café, open space, free microphone, graphic facilitation, storytelling, round table, debate, simulation, forum theatre, street animation, quest, street interview, creative workshops, movie, cultural learning. Through them we aim to develop and deepen the participants' knowledge on the discussed subject and important abilities for their personal development: critical thinking, multilateral analysis, team spirit, art of conviction, leadership, artistic skills, communication capacity, spirit of initiative.

PARTICIPANTS:

From each country will take part 6 young participants (18-30 years old) and 1 group leader (above 18, no superior age limit) from each of the mentioned countries -7 persons per country.

TRAVEL:

You will arrive in Cluj-Napoca (or simply Cluj, as most Romanians prefer to call it) at the Avram Iancu Airport (CLJ). It is the only airport in the city of Cluj-Napoca and the biggest one in Transylvania: <u>http://airportcluj.ro/</u>

To get to the city center you will use the public transport. Bus line 5 of the local public transit system CTP Cluj-Napoca runs between the airport and the city of Cluj-Napoca. The trolleybus departs approximately every 10 minutes between 05:00 a.m. and 22:00 p.m., on weekends and evenings every 15 to 20 minutes. The airport bus stop is located 200 metres from the terminal, along the 'Strada Traian Vuia'. It is a short walk from the terminal, you first have to go to the main road and then to the right. In the centre of Cluj-Napoca, you can get off at the stops Constanta (Regionale CFR), Sora and Central. The bus ride to one of these bus stops in the centre of Cluj-Napoca takes an average of 25 minutes. The first and final stop of bus line 5 is known as Fierul and can be found in the street 'Strada Cuza Voda'. Tickets are available at vending machines and service counters near the bus stops.

Keep in mind, it is not possible to buy a ticket from the bus driver. The price is 2.00 RON for a single ride and 4.00 RON for two journeys. In addition, you can take bus line 8 for travelling between the airport and downtown Cluj-Napoca, the bus runs about every 20 minutes and only from Monday till Friday.Schedule for line 5:http://ctpcj.ro/index.php/en/timetables/urban-lines/linia-5Schedule for line 8:http://ctpcj.ro/index.php/en/timetables/urban-lines/line8

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE:

The arrival day to Cluj-Napoca is 25 of October 2019, the latest you could come being 8.00 PM! If for some reasons you cannot find tickets with morning or after-noon arrival time please email us and we will find a solution for you! The arrival hour is set this way because we need to leave for Vatra Dornei in the evening and will have a night travel, arriving on the 26th of October! You can also arrive 1 or 2 days earlier to visit Cluj-Napoca, on your own expense.

We will depart back to Cluj-Napoca on 4th of November in the evening, so make sure you have flights that leave not earlier than 7:00-8:00 a.m. on 5th of November, because we will again have a nigh travel in order to reach Cluj-Napoca in the morning of October 5th! You can also stay in Cluj-Napoca 1-2 days later and visit, on your own expense.

IMPORTANT!

The meeting point for the departure to Poiana Negrii will be at an accessible location in Cluj-Napoca and set later on.

As additional advice, don't change too much money inside the airport because of the bad rates compared to the exchange offices downtown (we recommend 5-10 euro maximum). If you choose to take a taxi, it will be your own expense because taxi fares are not refunded in our project, having available public transport.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS AND REIMBURSEMENT:

You need to send us by email (or bring with you) all original receipts, invoices, e-tickets and boarding passes!

We strongly encourage you to buy flights that have the possibility to do online check-in and in this way you will be able to give us the return boarding passes as well, without sending them to us by post when you return home!

If for your airline is not possible, you still need to send us the boarding passes by post after the project. It is very important to have all your travel and financial documents with you for each person, otherwise the reimbursement is not possible!

Reimbursement will be done by bank transfer in the account of your sending organization, according to the rules of Erasmus+. Maximum amount of reimbursement per participant is 275 EUR.

LOCATION:

We chose a location that is in the middle of the mountainous nature that also benefits fully of the comfort of modern life. It is a place that we know very well and used in many other projects in the past.

We will stay usually 2-3 persons in one room, maybe some rooms will host a maximum of 4 persons. It may be possible to have two persons in one bed because some rooms are designed as matrimonial rooms, but the beds are big enough and each of you will have their own sheets.

There is signal for mobile and wi-fi internet connection throughout the establishment.

WHAT TO BRING:

TYPICAL FOOD AND DRINKS FROM YOUR COUNTRIES

We will have traditional evenings during the project and basically every evening will belong to a different country. Unfortunately we don't have budget to reimburse you the expenses made for the things that you are bringing, but try to be creative and funny! You can bring typical costumes, ornaments, leaflets, posters, flyers, food, sweets, alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks... and so on! There may be the possibility to cook something using the kitchen of the establishment. Also, you can show videos, photos, sing and dance traditional dances from your countries! We are counting on you to make these evenings as interesting as possible and promise to help you in any way that we can!!!

WARM CLOTHES

In October, weather can be tricky in the mountains! Prepare for temperatures between 15 Celsius or more during the day and as low as 0 Celsius during nights. It is recommended to bring some warm clothes in case it rains or you wish to stay outside during the evening, when it gets chilly. As well, we advise you to bring your own towels and whatever you need for taking shower, washing, etc.

GOOD SHOES

and proper clothes for outdoors. The mountains of the area are very beautiful, so we might organize one hiking trip (8-9 hours, medium difficulty) with the entire group and it is mandatory to have proper hiking equipment if you wish to take part. More details about that will come in the weeks before the exchange, because it is important to take into consideration the weather, temperature, amount of snow and other technicalities, before venturing on a hiking path.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Although we can't reimburse you the cost of health insurances, we strongly encourage you to make one! Romania is an EU member state, so an insurance for traveling here should be cheap and easy to make. If you have a European Health Card, please bring it with you, it is valid in our hospital system also and can replace a regular insurance.

RESEARCH

Research about the situation of youth (representation, involvement in local/regional politics, attitude towards leadership, participation at elections, etc) in your home countries.

Each national team should prepare a brief research on the matter before coming to Romania and during work sessions explain and give practical examples from its country.
